PERSONNEL

.31A-C REQUIREMENTS FOR PERSONNEL

- Provider must reside in the home and provide care
- Primary providers and/or substitutes are at least 18 yrs old
- Aides at least 16 years of age and work under provider
- Caretakers and volunteers must demonstrate an interest in and knowledge of children
- Caretakers children have not been placed in foster care or residential care due to abuse or neglect**
- Provider's must not be under the influence of any substance**
- Caregivers/volunteers must be familiar w/ RULES & REGS
- Provider must plan staff development
- Provider must supervise the care and activities of children**
- Health evaluations for all persons residing in the home Updated every 2 years or as required for provider/children**
- Provider health/mental condition- must have substitute or cease care until health risk is eliminated must cease.

INFANT / TODDLER

- PROVIDER IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS OLD
- TWO PROVIDERS: ONE IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS OLD AND THE SECOND EQUALLY QUALIFIED PROVIDER IS 18 YEARS OLD
- EACH PROVIDER MUST HAVE COMPLETED ONE YEAR OF SUPERVISED EXPERIENCE CARING FOR CHILDREN YOUNGER THAN THREE YEARS OLD

LARGE HOME

- LICENSEE RESIDES IN HOME AND 18 YEARS OF AGE
- PRIMARY CAREGIVER MEETS MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS
- NO FOUNDED COMPLAINTS SEVERITY LEVEL 1-3 (2 YRS)

CHILD CARE SERVICES

.71 A-F HEALTH CARE, MEDICATION, COMMUNICABLE DISEASE, SUN PROTECTION, SECOND (2ND) HAND SMOKE, AND FIRST AID SUPPLIES.

- At the time of admission: Health info. (Allergies, Meds, etc.) Information and health care plan*
- Current immunization or exemption on an approved form*
- A current health status or scheduled appointment within 30days*
- Notification of all non-immunized children*
- Statements of health for children under two years of age must meet "National Pediatric Recommended Schedule".*
- Children 2 up to 7 years; Health status is due annually*
- Children 7 and older; Health status is due every 3 years*
- Must obtain written authority for emergency medical care PRIOR to admission*
- Injured/ Ill children should be cared for and separated from group*
- All meds. (routine, prescription, over-the-counter, homeopathic, OR vitamin) may only be given with a written order by a health care provider, AND a signed order from parent.*
- Epinephrine can only be given in case of emergency, with signed order from health care professional.*
- Nebulizer can only be given with signed order from health care provider.*
- Topical preparation preventive-parent authorization*
- ALL medications must be in original container & labeled*
- Providers administering meds have Department Approved Medication Admin. Training*
- Meds must be stored in locked area, inaccessible to children*
- Medication logs must be kept for all children*
- Parents and health department notified of communicable illness*
- Individual with diagnosed communicable illness can only be re- admitted w/ note from health care provider or Health Department*
- Parents must be informed of sunscreen used at the facility*
- Children under 4 can apply sunscreen to self with supervision*
- Sunscreen must be at least SPF 30 and be full-spectrum UVA/UVB*
- First aid supplies to be inaccessible to children at all times*

NOTES

.72 A-C HYGIENE, DIAPER CHANGING AND TOY CLEANING

- Caregiver hands washed with soap & water at home, field trips, Parks, after toileting, wiping noses, before preparing/serving food, or meds., or handling animals*
- Children's hands are washed with soap and water prior to eating, after toileting....*

- Individual towels and drinking cups-not shared**
- Hand sanitizer and wipes not allowed unless on outings (not allowed for children under 3 year of age)**
- Diaper-changing area smooth, durable, nonabsorbent and easily cleanable and large enough for child**
- Diaper changing procedures are followed: diapers changed promptly, clean area, gloves, hand washing, disinfect, etc.**
- Toys cleaned once a week or when mouthed, soiled or contaminated**

.73 A-P FOOD AND NUTRITION

- Nutritious meals and snacks are served at suitable intervals**
- Food offered to children at intervals not more than three hours apart
- Food must be stored in a safe and sanitary manner**
- Provider must supplement children's meals that are inadequate
- Providers & parents must commute regarding special
- Foods offered shall be age appropriate-no choking**
- Children are encouraged, but not forced to eat or drink**
- Children with special needs are included in meal areas**
- All milk and juice must be pasteurized**
- Juice once a day. Sweets no more than twice a week
- Water available and not substituted for milk during meals**
- Individual dishes and utensils**
- Food not given contrary to religious beliefs or allergy**
- Dishes, cookware, high chairs trays and utensils must be Washed, sanitized and stored safe manner**
- Food preparation and service areas must be sanitary**
- Formula or breast milk not warmed in micro or reused**
- Breast fed infants not offered formula or other liquids**
- Infants unable to hold the bottle must be held facing provider**
- Infants and toddlers no bottles or Sippie cups when lying flat**
- Bottle must be labeled the child's name**
- Food must be appropriate for infant's developmental stages
- No new foods shall be introduced to children under 12 months without parent permission**
- Infants shall have/developmentally appropriate solid foods
- Infants and toddlers or directly supervised while eating**
- Honey and products containing honey not served under 12 months

ACTIVITIES

.741 A-C DIRECT CARE OF CHILDREN

- Provider must supervise and know the location and activity of all children at all times.**
- Provider's own children who are 12 and older may have 1 Friend 12 or older over, if does not interfere with supervision of children in care and they can be sent home if needed.**
- On occasion other children can visit if properly supervised by visiting parent and square footage allows.**

.742 A-N PHYSICAL CARE

- Environment is developmentally appropriate
- Child has frequent, individual, personal contact with adult
- Infants are held frequently**
- Children are picked up appropriately**
- Children are dressed appropriately for the weather**
- Provider responds to needs of child and investigates crying**
- Children greeted individually at upon arrival and departure**
- Licensed area access to parents at all times
- No Individuals can be or be under the influence or a controlled substances, alcohol, or drugs. No drug paraphernalia on the premises**

.75 A-J SLEEP AND WAKING TIME

- Nap area away from children playing
- Children not confined to equipment that inhibits freedom of movement (30 minutes) Confinement never used as discipline**
- Rest period required for children in care over 4 hours
- Alternative activities provided for non sleeping children
- Children are provided with suitable sleeping equipment**
- Department Approved Safe Sleep Training Date _____**
- Appropriate crib, playpen or infant futon for infants (12mo)**
- Soft bedding/materials that pose suffocation hazard not permitted under 12 months**
- Cribs and playpens must be sturdy, safe and free of hazards**
- Bassinette may be used per manufacturer requirements**
- Infants placed on their backs to sleep**
- Sound monitoring equipment is used when children are sleeping in separate rooms
- Napping children must always be supervised by either sight or sound and should be in an atmosphere conducive to rest or sleep
- Children awake not confined to equipment no more than 15 minutes**
- Supervised tummy time 20-30 mins a day
- Comfortable clothing- Clothing sacks in lieu of blankets
- Safe Sleep Policy
- Second Hand Smoke Policy

.76 A-F OVERNIGHT CARE

- Regular overnight care (past midnight) allowed only if licensed
- Child provided w/ a bed, cot, sofa, mat or crib with (2) sheets & Bed covering. 40 sq ft for each bed Spaced 2 feet apart
- Sheets changed for different children or weekly if same child
- Child's teeth brushed, hands and face washed and sleep clothing
- Provider sleep on same level if under 8 years
- Written permission to share equipment or rooms

Guidance, Learning Activities and Media Use

.81 A-J GUIDANCE

- Discuss expectations with parents
- Must be appropriate and educational**
- No corporal or harsh punishment**
- No restraints of any kind may be used**
- Not associated with food, rest, or toileting**
- Separation must be brief and appropriate.**
- Verbal and emotional abuse or remarks is prohibited**
- Children must not punish other children**
- Children not punished for parent or guardians behaviors**

.82 A-J LEARNING ACTIVITIES

- Talking to children is social and not limited**
- Children communication developmentally appropriate**
- Children provided opportunity for group and individual play
- Adult directed projects kept to a minimum**
- No forced participation: alternate activities available**
- Culturally sensitive and diverse activities; variety of materials**
- Boys and girls not restricted to specific role play**
- 1 language activity offered daily**
- 1 musical activity weekly**

.83 A-M Materials

- At least 4 Infant/toddler & 10 books for over 2 must be available**
- Materials are developmentally appropriate, culturally Sensitive & represents diversity for all children**

- Blocks & accessories accessible for free play daily

- MATERIALS MUST BE DOUBLE FOR LARGE HOMES
- Dry materials or water play should be offered monthly

.84 A-B MEDIA USE

- Use of all media (audio, visual, etc.) only to be permitted w/
 - Written permission by parent or guardian
 - Parent approved times limits
 - May not include questionable content, and must have a rating appropriate for the children in care

Facility Requirements and Transportation

.91 A-M GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- Entire premises is subject to inspection
- No hazardous business in the home
- Mobile homes are properly installed/skirted and have 2 exits
- Home and outdoor play area are safe and free from hazards
- Weapons are kept unstrung / unloaded and in separate locked containers away from ammunition and arrows
- All garbage is stored in a manner inaccessible to children
- No fire hazards
- Stairways with more than 5 stairs have rails with slats no more than 4 inches apart
- Well water is tested annually Date: _____
- Animals posing a potential threat are separated from children
- Dogs and cats are properly vaccinated against rabies
- Expiration Dates: _____; _____; _____
- Psittacine/hooks beak birds inaccessible
- Children prohibited from mistreating animals
- Heating units are safe
- Play equip. designed against entrapment and strangulation
- Swing sets/large play equipment are stabilized & anchored
- Swing seats for children 3 & older made of flexible material
- All exercise equipment must be inaccessible

.921 A-I INDOOR REQUIREMENTS

- Open, indoor play space 35-sq. ft per child
- THE LARGE HOME MUST PROVIDE SUFFICIENT FLOOR SPACE IN SPECIFIC ROOMS THAT DOES NOT INCLUDE HOUSEHOLD FURNITURE
- One room or area in the home must contain a bed, cot, or Sofa and must be available for a sick or injured child
- Floors must have an easily cleanable finish
- Interior walls free of holes w/ smooth finish for cleaning
- The home must be equipped with adequate light, heat, ventilation, and plumbing

- All rooms kept in a clean and sanitary condition free of pest and rodent infestation
- Stairways of more than four steps accessible to children under two must have a gate. Never lift children or step over a gate

.922 A-E INDOOR EQUIPMENT/ MATERIALS /FURNISHINGS

- Toy, toy parts and materials accessible to children under three must be large enough that they cannot be swallowed
- Adequate # of high chairs and other suitable equipment that meets standards provided for children under two
- Walkers with wheels prohibited
- Furnishings and equipment and toys in good repair

.923 A-P INDOOR SAFETY

- All hazardous items and materials must be inaccessible to children
- All electric outlets, power strips, exposed lights covered
- Electrical cords must be in good condition
- Window blind cords /coverings must be secured and out of reach
- Fans that pose a safety hazard must be inaccessible
- Doors may be locked but must allow permit easy exit
- No locks or fastening devices
- Any level where child care occurs must have two means of Escape
- Basement 2nd exit (window) appropriately sized/ for escape and permanently secured
- Upper levels must have escape ladders
- All heating units must be installed and maintained
- Any cooking stoves with controls shall have a safety guard
- Flammable or combustible items not stored within 3 feet of furnace or hot water heater
- A smoke detector must be installed on each level of the home
- A carbon monoxide detectors installed as required
- One five pound fire extinguisher with a 2A-10-BC rating highly visible and easily accessible
- Use of indoor climbing equipment subject to 7.707.932

NOTES: _____

“Available” means materials or equipment that is not immediately accessible to children, but which may be introduced with adult aid.

“Accessible” means children being able to obtain equipment and materials without adult aid, may be age/development specific.

“Immediately” means without delay or hesitation, without any interval of time.

OUTDOOR REQUIREMENTS

.931 A-O GENERAL OUTDOOR REQUIREMENTS

- 75-sq. feet of useable outdoor play space per child
- Enclosed w/ 42 inch fence or natural barrier
- All parts are easily visible
- Shade is provided in outdoor play area
- Decks more than 12 inches high have a protective railing or barrier with slats no wider than 4 inches apart
- Tiered yards w/ over 12” drop off must have railing or barrier
- Free of animal contamination

- Window wells accessible to children have covers
- Protective fence (5') around swimming pools and locked
- Hot tubs have bolted and securely locked covers
- ponds are fenced or have child proof grates
- Trampoline use is prohibited and must be inaccessible
- Tree houses must be inaccessible to children
- Walkways free of snow and ice

- Vehicle must meet safety standards of DMV
- IN A LARGE HOME THERE MUST BE AT LEAST ONE (1) ADULT SUPERVISOR, IN ADDITION TO DRIVER, WHEN NINE (9) TO TWELVE (12) CHILDREN ARE USING THE VEHICLE
- Written permission from parent or guardian to transport child
- Transportation agreements made for school-age children with the child's parent or guardian
- Children remaining at home during transportation must be supervised.

.932 A-E OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT/MATERIALS /SURFACING

- All permanent climbing equipment has 4 inches of protective surface
- There must be 6 inches of protective surface
- Sand must be regularly raked and resilient
- Sand that is compact and lost depth must be replaced with another approved surface
- Portable equipment over 2 feet must have protective surfacing-NO cement or grass
- All swing set and climbing equipment must have FALL ZONE that meets standards.

| RESTRICTIONS AND APPEALS |
|--------------------------|
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.933 A-F OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

- Daily outdoor play unless severe weather or written plan from child's doctor
- Developmentally appropriate supervision
- Children are directly supervised in any other outside area used
- Children must wear helmets & have protective gear when riding: skateboards, scooters, bicycles and rollerblades. **MOTORIZED TOYS NOT PERMITTED**
- Protective surfacing: sand, wood chips, wood mulch, engineered wood fiber, pea gravel, synthetic pea gravel and shredded rubber tires.
- Approved protective surfacing or mats

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.934 A-C OUTDOOR SAFETY

- Children directly or actively supervised near standing water
- Outdoor area free of hazardous materials and debris
- Outdoor area free from safety hazards: tools, lawn mower, propane, building scraps, etc.
- Propane on grills must have safety on/off knob on it

.94 A-HTransportation

- Driver must follow required state laws
- At least one adult in the vehicle must have current CPR and First Aid training
- Children must be properly restrained in a system that meets the Colorado Child Passenger Safety Law
- The driver is responsible for ensuring that all children are properly restrained
- Children under the age of 13 may never be transported in the front seat of the vehicle
- Children must never be left alone in the vehicle
- The total number of children transported shall never exceed the manufacturer's specifications
